Load Distribution of Web Crawling

Master thesis work for two students - 30 hec

Objective

The objective of this thesis is to develop a system capable of distributing the load incurring from crawling product data from the web at scale using state of art technology.

Background

Product information, such as name, category, brand and price, is used extensively by a variety of services on the web. Still, this information is difficult to get unless there is structured data feeds prepared with public access. This is rare and creates problems for services which makes use of product information, such as price comparison sites and bid optimization software for online advertising.

adomi.co is solving this problem by using innovative web crawling technologies. The current challenges include load distribution.

Tasks

- · Identify and validate methods and systems that can be used for this purpose
- · Implement these to be used with the web crawler
- · Develop test methodology to be used for testing the methods and systems on real data
- · Document the results in a written report in English

Project Structure

The project can be done from anywhere, but we would prefer you to be based in Göteborg, Sweden.

The thesis is suitable for two students and consists of 30 hec credits.

- Fluent in programming, preferably Python
- Experience with analyzing large data sets using Hadoop
