NFR = Non-Functional Requirements, a.k.a Quality Requirements (QR)

Start to explain what non-functional requirements are:

- Non-functional requirements are also called quality requirements
- Non-functional requirements specify how well the system must perform its functions,
- how fast must it respond, how easy must it be to use and so forth
- Many non-functional requirements are not only software requirements, but
- requirements for the entire system, for example response time, depend on hardware as
- well as software.
- Non-functional requirements can be measured on a sliding scale, it is not something
- For example, usability, performance, maintainability, reliability, testability, safety,
- security.
