

Key Matters: A selection of deduced findings

- * If one looks at **other nations**, on the one hand one has a **government mandate** and on the other a state driven demand for BIM together with **state driven national standards**.
- ♦ In Sweden development and implementation of BIM has been deliberately left to the AEC organizations.
- *A bridging of the gap in BIM guidance exists in Sweden thru' the development of In-House BIM-Manuals.
- *Problem: In-House manuals limit the spreading of knowledge and good practice and risk divergence or even contridiction in process and methodology.
- *Lack of National Vision There is a risk associated with the failure to have a national strategic approach to BIM, and that is the *uncessary and avoidable divergence in the strategic direction of BIM to the norm encountered on the international stage.*
- *Challenges exists in aligning or harmonizing DK / SE guidelines as they have emerged from different drivers & initiatives (and therefore have discrete content, scope and positioning):
 - * BIM implementation & documentation in SE is largely market driven and the result of private initiatives. National guidelines are not specifically BIM orientated & don't have a broad audience.
 - * DK guidelines are centrally driven and the result of public initiatives, have a broad audience, have the capacity to form the basis for BIM implementation in a consistent way.
